Ken Battle of 6101 Poplar Beach asked what will the charge be for more consumption. He asked about # 27 water rates if final or not, what will happen with storm water and under the road water drain pipes. He questioned the leach line, the footage from the lake and # 16. It was said that Hobie would sign off and must approve any pre-existing pipe. Ken asked about # 22 whether it will be above or below 60 PSI.

Bob Ostrander questioned amortization and the cost per unit. Will the charge be on the taxes even if one is not receiving the water unit?

Jim asked about # 12 and the directional bore of 4.5 feet, # 16 will this be at the discretion of the Romulus water district? And, # 27 that the water rates are not finalized.

Councilman Kyle Collinworth suggested that written signatures could be an idea for waivers.

Cheryl asked about being next to a State creek with possibly garbage from a flood. She questioned # 35 water pressure and check valves and possible lake water contamination.
