

# *Dog Report*

**10/27/22 Interlaken-** received a 3rd party dog bite complaint. I explained that the person bit, needed to contact me. Was called by Sherry Jones, regarding a bite that occurred at Conifer Apartments. The dog belongs to Donna Treleven. I took all of Mrs. Jones information for the bite report and went to make contact with Mrs. Treleven. She was under quarantine for Covid and I left a message.

**11/02/22- Interlaken-** Mrs. Treleven called me to follow up. She was upset her apartment complex gave her a 19 day notice to get rid of her dog. I explained that was separate from the 10 day quarantine her dog was on, and was also out of my hands. Her dog is currently licensed and up to date on Rabies, the quarantine was a precaution. I told her she would have to speak with her apartment complex about their notice.

**11/05/22- Ovid-** received a text and phone complaint about a puppy that came from a house in Ovid. Complaint has no idea how long the current owner had had the puppy, only that she felt it was due to its living conditions and previous owners. I explained I could do a wellness check for the dogs currently living at the residence, but was limited as to what I could do. She stated she was also waiting on a call back from the State police. I went to the Cook residence on Main st and explained the complaint. Mr. Cook and his wife brought their adult Shepard out so I could see them. Aside from the white one being a little thin due to a recent food change, all dogs looked to be in good condition. I thanked them and left. I followed up with the complaint and explained the dogs were in good condition and she insisted I inspect the home. I explained that was not something I am able to do. She stated she doesn't believe they care for them the way she would.

**11/06/22 Ovid-** a State trooper from troop E called to follow up, and he stated he explained to her that I do not have the authority to search homes. I explained I saw the dogs and the owners explained why the white Shepard was losing weight. He said thank you and that was it.

**11/07/22-Lodi-** received a phone call regarding an animal complaint. Caller explained ge needed someone to come pick up an injured Owl. I referred the caller to the Finger Lakes Raptor Center in Lodi and explained I am not equipped to handle birds of prey.

**11/09/22- Romulus-** received a call from a gentleman wanting to do an owner surrender, due to the dog biting. I explained that he would need to contact the shelter to see if they would take the dog and he stated that none of the local shelters would take him due to him biting numerous residents in the home. He stated he would have to put him down if I didn't take him. I explained I am not set up for owner surrenders and he would need to find a rescue.

**11/12/22- Romulus-** 911 center call to assist State Parks police with 3 dogs at the rest stop on Rte 414 in Romulus. Upon arrival, I picked up 2 approximately 4 month old pomsky puppies. The female was leary and wouldn't come to us, bit walked up the road towards an Amish residence. The park police and I went to the residence, and the owner and his children were heading out to looking for them, they had gotten out. The mother came up the driveway and went to the barn. His children put the puppies in the barn. The police and I explained they had been in and out of the road, and that they would need to be licensed.

**11/18/22- Romulus-** received a phone complaint about a St. Bernard and lab that were running in a hedgerow along Pam Armitages property. Pam stated the dogs belonged to John Overbeck. Drove down but was unable to located the dogs. Received another called from Pam at approximately 6pm, stating that 2 back and white dogs were running up Cayuga Lake rd, and that they also belonged to John overbeck. I messaged John and let him know I had gotten a complaint, and that I was on my way to pick up the dogs and take them to the shelter. He messaged back, stating he had the dogs. I explained that his dogs cab not run lose, and that he can get tickets in addition to having to pick them up from the shelter if they are picked up.

**11/22/22-**State inspection with Caitlin from Ags and Markets. Approved for 24 hour holds, and will follow up with Caitlin 12/22 to finish insepction and paperwork. There were a number of DL18 forms from Beverly's both her and I needed to follow up on.

1. Towns need an emergency vet on call in case I pick up an injured dog. Towns are not required to do anything heroic, just make sure the dog is stable pending owner notification. It may also be helpful to see if a vet would be willing to work with the Towns for Rabies vaccinations, on dogs are claimed but need shots. I can meet owners at the vet with the dog, owners would pay vet fees and get the dog licensed before turning them dog over to the owners. There is currently a limited number of Rabies clinics.
2. I would ask that all towns check to make sure their local dog laws are updated with the current prices for impounded dogs. Ovid and Lodi- \$17.00 per dog, Romulus and Covert \$25.00 per dog and also State is this fee is doubled after each impoundment.

**11/26/22-Romulus-** call from Cindy Ferris retarding a missing Amish dog. I explainedi hadn't gotten any found dog calls but would keep my ears open. She called back about 39 minutes later and she'd they found the dog in a barn, safe.
