01/09/2023-OVID- recieved a call at 9:30 am regarding 2 dogs running loose on Main St in front of the old fire department. They were in and out of the road and almost caused an accident. The caller had them at the former fire department. I went up and picked up a husky and a pitbull mix. i recongized them from a call on December 31st, where the owner met me when i was getting ready to take them. I called the owner, Dwayne Schrader, and let him know that i had them and that he would need to pick them up at the shelter. He hadn't yet licensed them and he didn't know where their Rabies Vaccines were. I took them to the Shelter and returned to their residence to give them with Impoundment Notification from the DL-18 form.

01/10/2023-COVERT- recieved a call 5pm, regarding a dog running loose on the corner of Knight St and Prospect St. Picked up a pit/hound mix and posted him to my Facebook page. The owner noticed and contacted me. Owner came to pick him up and paid the impoundment fee. 5 days was given to license.

01/16/2023-OVID- recieved a facebook message regarding dogs barking on Main st. Complaintant stated the dogs had been outside barking off and on for an hour or so. Complaintant then stated that the dogs were back inside, and no longer barking. I explained the habitual barking law to her and told her i would monitor the situation.

01/27/2023-OVID- recieved a call from the 911 Center to assist with a call on Co Rd 129 for a house fire with a dog inside and the dog was recieving oxygen. While enroute i recieved a call from Carrie Smalser saying they had the dog in back of the Ambulance and i could come up there. Upon arriving on scene, i was directed to park behind the fire trucks. Once i got to the ambulance i was cleared to bring my van up and the dog was loaded into my car. I then spent 2 hours on the phone looking for a local vet who could get her seen as soon as possible. I was able to get her in at Ameriland Animal Hospital, and the vet cleared her. She sent me home with medications and medicated shampoo for the dog. Suki, was treated for minor burns, and the vet said her lungs were clear. this is most definetly due to the fast work of the Ovid, Lodi, Interlaken Fire crews, South Seneca Ambulance Crew, and the Seneca County Sheriff's office for their fast response. The owner, Derek Steen, contacted me and he came to pick her up. I explained her medications to him, and that the medications were something he needed to pay the vet for and that the inital office visit was paid for by the town. He was given 10 days to license her due to him not being able to access

her shot records in the home. I also did not charge him the impoundment fees, as this was an emergency call and not the fault of the owner that the dog was taken from his home. Spoke with Joe Borst about looking into getting a badge made so i could have something to identify me as DOg Control during an emergency situation.

01/28/2023- OVID- Barking dog complaint again on Main St at the Cook Residence. I went and there was a dog outside, and the adult in the home (not the owners) immediatley brought it inside. The young lady i spoke with stated that the dog was only outside a short period of time.

01/28/2023-OVID delivered tickets. total of 14 tickets issued and submitted to Court.

Interlaken- Filling out tickets and court paperwork for a total of 11 tickets to be issued in the begining of February.

DCO TRAINING- regristration has been submitted for my Basic Animal Control Certification course April 3-6 2023 in the Town of Watkins Glen. The Town of Ovid has offered to submit the payment and then the other towns can send their reimbursement amount to the town of Ovid. That way there is only 1 check for payment, versus 4. It would also be a great idea for each town to contract with a local vet for emergency sitations, so we can get any injured dogs seen as soon as possible. Town would only be responsible for the inital vet visit, owners would be responsible for treatments and medications the vet recommends.
